




USGS ShakeMap of the San Francisco Bay region showing estimated shaking intensities for the hypothetical magnitude-7.0 mainshock selected for the scenario.

Early alert works!

Today I was hanging out with the family watching movies as hurricane Hillary was passing by OC with heavy rain and winds, when all of a sudden I got an alert in my apple watch from an app I've never heard/seen before, so it caught my attention right away and it was something like "brace yourself, earthquake with Ventura epicenter" more
